Course Description

This course introduces one or more technology or research topics for discussion and exploration. Topic selection may vary from year to year, driven by the outside influences such as industry input, new technology trends, or learner interests.

Rationale

While theoretical foundations of computing are now relatively stable, the number of new trends and technologies is overwhelming. As a result, timely introduction of these new developments into curricula becomes a problem. This course is intended to become a delivery platform for both new technologies and advanced topics in foundations of computing.

Learning Outcomes

Students are required to successfully complete each course outcome. In keeping with NSCC's approach to portfolio learning, students will have demonstrated the ability to:

1. Explore technology of interest and develop small applications based on this technology.
2. Explore and apply selected foundational theories to solve real-life problems.
3. Discuss and compare technologies studied in real life contexts.
4. Produce professional level communication documents and presentations using an office software suite.
